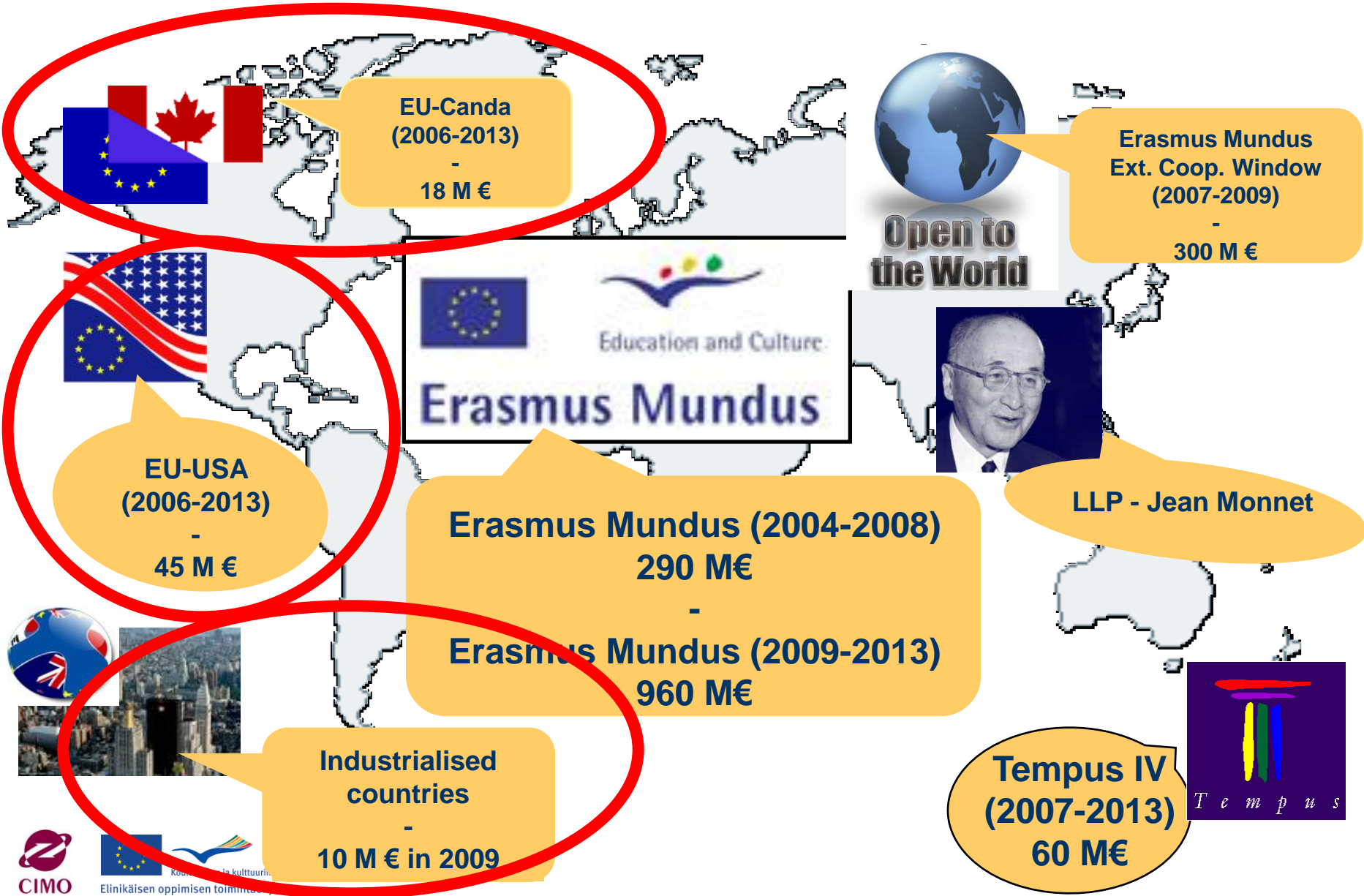
Why this session?

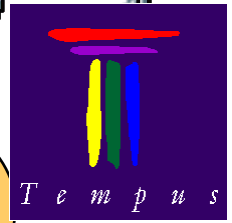

- EU-US ATLANTIS Programme

- EU-CANADA Transatlantic Exchange Partnerships (TEP) Programme
- EU-ICI ECP - Education Cooperation Programme Australia, Japan, New Zealand and Republic of Korea

Key features of co-operation activities

- Joint **development of innovative curricula**;
- Two-way **exchange of students** with full recognition of study abroad, possibility of internships;
- **Faculty exchanges**;
- **All fields** in higher education and vocational training;
- Balanced partnerships;
 - E.g. EU-Canada: the organizations involved will be schools at least from two different country in Europe and two from two different provinces in Canada
- Joint selection and funding.

Call 2009: deadline 23 March 2009, budget 5 M€



- **EU-Canada Transatlantic Exchange Partnerships – TEP**

Call 2009: deadline 1 April 2009, budget 1,104 M€



- **ICI-ECP – Education Cooperation Partnerships**

Call 2009: 15 Sept, budget 2,8 M€

Lifelong Learning Programme and external cooperation

Purpose

- New from Call 2010!!!
- Not a new action, only new dimension to existing actions
- Not foreign aid, improving the quality of education and training in Europe
- Mutual beneficiality

Only in centralised projects

- Multilateral projects and multilateral networks in all four LLP-programmes
 - E.g. Leonardo Development of Innovation, Leonardo Networks
- Three key activities
 - Education and training policy (KA1), languages (KA2) and ICT (KA3)
- Not in e.g. Transfer of Innovation, partnerships or mobility actions managed by CIMO!

Countries

Some or all of the following, will be outlined more precisely in the call for proposals 2010:

- Switzerland (will join fully 2011)
- Croatia, Macedonia (have joined but only partially)
- USA, Canada, Australia, Japan, New Zealand and South Korea
- Russia, Brasil, China, India, Israel, Mexico, South Africa
- Jordan, Syria, Lebanon, Occupied Palestinian Territory, Algeria, Tunisia, Libya, Egypt, Morocco, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Ukraine. Moldoca and Georgia
- Also any others if demonstrably important expertise to share

Practical issues

- Preliminary information...
- Max 25 000 euro for third country participation per project
- Normally one partner from third country, if more partners same maximum applies
- Budget on top of normal budget
- Separate assessment and decision

Other forms of cooperation

Funding and grants

- National internationalisation grants (National Board of Education)
 - Any country is possible if well described
- Fulbright Mid Career Professional Development, Fulbright Graduate Grants
 - USA
